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Key Resolutions 1

- Agenda 4. Global geodetic reference frame

The Committee of Experts:

- (a) Welcomed the report prepared by the Geodetic Reference Framework for Sustainable Development Working Group of UN-GGIM Asia-Pacific.
- (d) Agreed that actions be taken to facilitate the submission of a resolution to be tabled at the 2013-14 Session of the UN General Assembly to seek support and commitment at the highest level.

- Agenda 6. Development of a global map for sustainable development.

The Committee of Experts:

- (c) Acknowledge the contribution of...ISCGM's (International Steering Committee for Global Mapping) current efforts to provide technical support to the GM4SD Working Group, and advised a closer working relationship be evolved between GM4SD and ISCGM, with the latter playing a central operating role.
- (e) Urged the Member States to participate in and contribute to the GM4SD Working Group in its activities.



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Key Resolutions 2

- Agenda 9. Linking of geospatial information to statistics and other data.

The Committee of Experts:

- (b) Acknowledged the critical importance of integrating geospatial information with statistics and socio-economic data and the development of a geospatial-statistical framework, especially in the context of the on-going debate on the post-2015 development agenda.
- (f) Encouraged national geospatial information authorities to reach out to their national statistical office counterparts to actively engage in a dialogue on better integration of statistical and geospatial information at the national level.

- Agenda 10. Critical issues relating to the integration of land and marine geospatial information.

The Committee of Experts:

- (b) Stressed the critical importance of better integration of land and marine geospatial information to facilitate planning and management, especially of coastal areas and waters in a seamless, interoperable and holistic way, and encouraged relevant national institutions to work together on these issues.
- (c) Encouraged Member States, in cooperation with IHO, FIG and other relevant national and international actors active in this field, to contribute to developing standardized and coordinated approaches to the integration of land and marine geospatial information.
